# **Marriage Study from Ephesians**

# (#1) Read Ephesians 1

1. In your own words, write down every spiritual blessing (v. 3) you discover in vv. 3-14. Relate each spiritual blessing to its significance for marriage.

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2. Pray vv. 15-23 as a blessing over your spouse (insert his or her name into your prayer).

# (#2) Read Ephesians 2:1-10 1. What do you learn in this passage about the character and attributes of God? 2. What do you learn about the sinfulness and frailty of man? 3. Read again each time that Christ is mentioned and write out your praise to God for the way in which he redeems the sinner. What is the new character of the believer in Christ? 4. How will you respond to the character of God and the work of Christ in view of your sin? 5. Pray for the good works which God prepared beforehand (v. 10) that you and your spouse would accomplish together in marriage, family, church, and witness.

# (#3) Read Ephesians 2:11-22

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| 1. | What was the major conflict between Jews and Gentiles? How did this animosity affect their spiritual well-being?   |
| 2. | If you had an unbelieving spouse, what conflicts over faith would be manifest in your marriage? Though you and your spouse are both believers, what conflicts show up when you live like your old selves?    |
| 3. | How does the gospel destroy conflict? Why is it impossible to love Christ, while at the same time, despise your spouse?  |
| 4. | Paul writes that the church is built on the cornerstone of Christ as a dwelling place for the Spirit (vv. 19-22). How is Christ central to your marriage and how is the Holy Spirit dwelling in your hearts? |
| 5. | Pray that you will learn to biblically resolve conflicts with your spouse. If you are presently struggling make a plan for confession, forgiveness, and reconciliation.                                      |

# (#4) Read Ephesians 3:1-4:16

| 1. | Paul declares that the manifold wisdom of God is made known to the world through the church (3:10). How does the church display God's wisdom to its members, to the world, and to spiritual rulers?                  |
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| 2. | Pray Paul's prayer in 3:14-21 for your spouse (insert his or her name into your prayer).   |
| 3. | Ephesians 4:1-16 speaks to unity in the body of Christ which begins at home in a Christian marriage. List all the marks of oneness that you share with your spouse and with other members in the body.               |
| 4. | The goal of discipleship is growing up into Christlikeness (vv. 11-16). How has your spouse become more like Christ over the years? How have you? Praise God for even the smallest evidences of grace.               |
| 5. | Paul exhorts the church to speak the truth in love (v 15a). In what specific ways could you have done this better during the past week? Make an intentional practice of speaking the truth in love this coming week. |

### (#5) Read Ephesians 4:17-5:21

1. Paul contrasts walking like the wicked and walking like those called by Christ (4:1, 17-19; 5:2, 8, 15), then gives four basic principles for putting off sin and putting on Christ (4:20-24). Apply to marriage the following examples he provides (4:25-5:21), then include some of your own examples as well.

# (#6) Read Ephesians 5:22-33

# (#7) Read Ephesians 6:1-24

1. If you have children, evaluate their level of obedience (vv. 1-3) (e.g., immediately, cheerfully, completely, without complaining). Evaluate your own commitment to bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord (v. 4). How are they being blessed or cursed by the health of your marriage?

2. Paul's instruction to slaves can be accommodated to modern-day employment (vv. 5-9). Have you made either laziness or work an idol which you desire more than Christ? Confess any work-related temptations that are sinfully harming your marriage and family.

| 3. | Paul exhorts Christians to put on the whole armor of God (vv. 10-18). Describe each piece |
